Social Contract (agreement between government and the people)

a.k.a. "consent of the governed"

People agree to less than 100% freedom

in exchange, the government protects individual rights

Locke (what a cool guy!)

Natural Rights - Life, Liberty, & Property

rights are God-given, not given by the king

the only purpose of government is to protect rights

If government doesn't protect rights, the people can change the government

Locke is the main influence on Thomas Jefferson writing the Declaration of Independence

Montesquieu

break government into three separate branches

this helps prevent anybody from gaining too much power (don't feed the tyrannosaurus)

Voltaire

Freedom of speech
